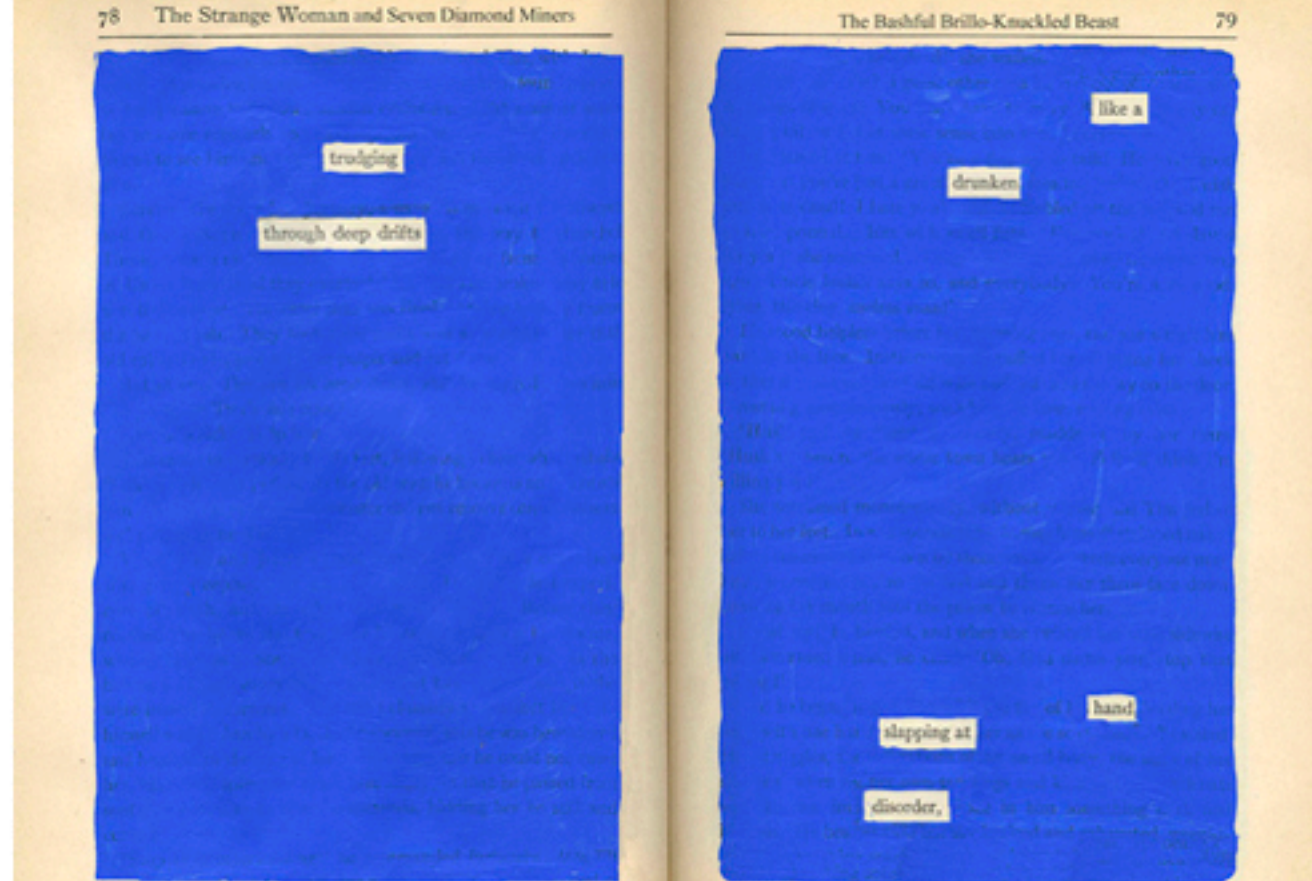

Westbeth is also home to the Martha Graham Dance Foundation, The New School for Drama, Brecht Forum and a host of others which feature cultural programming and events.
